These meetings typically occur on the first Tuesday of March, June, September and December and the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of January, April, July, and October at 9:00am (these times may be adjusted as needed). Meeting attendance of at least 50 percent is required. Position term is two years with the option to serve multiple terms.

**Ideal Qualifications**

The pediatric emergency nurse must be employed as nurse in an emergency department or trauma setting. Professional interest and desire to lead efforts which improve pediatric emergency is required. The ideal candidate will have professional certification as a Certified Pediatric Emergency Nurse. Candidates with experience leading pediatric quality improvement and performance improvement initiatives are strongly encouraged to apply.
