VACANCY: Contracted Emergency Department Trainer

GENERAL SUMMARY:

This contracted role is dedicated to pediatric training at community emergency departments, an initiative of the statewide Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) program, which is a grant funded partnership of the federal EMSC program administered by Children's Health Alliance of Wisconsin (Alliance) in partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). The Alliance is a statewide child health advocacy organization affiliated with Children's Hospital of Wisconsin (CHW). The Emergency Department Trainer will work to improve pediatric emergency care at community emergency departments. Primary responsibilities, under the guidance of EMSC advisory committee and EMSC leader and program manager, include developing training content for community emergency departments and leading onsite training for community emergency departments. The emergency department trainer will receive a stipend of \$500 for each training provided (approximately five hours). The Emergency Department trainer will be reimbursed for travel mileage at the IRS mileage rate; parking and tolls; hotel room expenses; and meals limited to the cost of food, nonalcoholic beverages and up to 20% gratuity. Trainings will scheduled on an as-needed basis and will be held approximately once per month at community emergency departments within the state.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Utilize their expertise and knowledge of pediatric emergency care to develop training content to be provided at community emergency departments.
- Lead onsite training at community emergency departments of approximately five hours in length.
- Maintain licensure as registered nurse, advanced practice nurse, physician or physician's assistant.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED:

- Licensed as registered nurse, advanced practice nurse, physician or physician's assistant
- Four years of related experience in emergency care.
- Strong planning, collaborative and organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Ability to travel to community emergency departments within the state.
