

#### **About Us...**

Children's Wisconsin is dedicated to the health and well-being of children, with a vision of Wisconsin kids being the healthiest kids in the nation. Midtown Pediatrics and Next Door Pediatrics are two of the 22 Children's Medical Group Primary Care clinics across Southeastern Wisconsin.

Midtown and Next Door Pediatrics includes 15 Pediatricians serving more than 8,000 patients, including a primarily Medicaid population, with a focus on addressing each patient's complete medical and social needs.


We do have processes in place to screen patients for food insecurity, in addition to other social determinants of health factors, however we are open to the opportunities that will improve our current processes, particularly the referral process.

# **Current Food Insecurity Programs for Awareness**

- Community Partnerships with upstart Kitchen and Pete's Market
- Healthy prepared meals for families ( Upstart kitchen)
- Midtown 100 meals provided monthly
- Next Door 50 meals provided monthly
- Daily food vouchers for families (Pete's Market)

# **Screening Process & Tool**

- Screener given by Medical Assistant at every visit
- Screener tool reviewed by medical provider
- Referral recommendations is given for family to case management
- Case Management will given food voucher for Pete's Market
- Case management will provided additional resources if needed
- Goal: Improve documentation in Epic



#### **Teaching and Learning**

We are hoping to learn and share ...

- What aspects of your work are you most eager to share with others?
  - Direct feedback from patients and clinical staff on what has not been successful in helping patients meet food insecurity needs.
  - Feedback and lived experiences with our patient population receiving unsuccessful referrals to food access
  - Children's Wisconsin not currently having a system approach to screening/referrals making local efforts "home grown"
  - Data on the clearly demonstrated need to help connect patients/families to resources addressing food insecurity (emergency/short term needs and sustainable/self-sufficiency journey)


#### Our vision...

# **60<sup>th</sup> Street Food Pantry**

- ▶ We serve zip codes 53218, 53224, and 53225.
- ▶ Clients can use the pantry once per month to receive basic grocery items meant to supplement the family's food supply.
- Prepackaged food boxes usually contain a mix of grains, protein, vegetables, fruits, dairy, and the amount of food is based upon the size of the family.



#### **Aspirations!**

The Salvation Army hopes to eventually re-open the 60<sup>th</sup> Street Food Pantry for pre-covid operations, allowing clients to come inside and experience a "choice" pantry instead of offering drive up service only.

We're excited to be part of the pilot project to connect more families to the 60<sup>th</sup> Street Food Pantry to help meet their basic needs and perhaps connect them to our seasonal programs.

Our vision is that every person has their basic needs met with compassion and dignity and without discrimination.
