
If you live in Milwaukee or Kenosha counties and are eligible for Medicaid state health insurance, find out how to access the following free services:

- Asthma self-care education at your home
- Asthma supplies up to \$1,000 for your home
- Home assessment to look for asthma triggers
- Home repairs up to \$5,000 for eligible repairs

These services can help you:

- Find ways to reduce asthma triggers at home.
- Learn how to better control your asthma.

 - Making fewer trips to the emergency room.
 - Avoiding overnight stays at the hospital.
 - Missing fewer days of school and work.

Three easy steps to access services



1. Ask your health care provider, school nurse, pharmacist or asthma educator for a referral to the Asthma-Safe Homes Program.



2. Meet an asthma educator for two to six sessions to get home supplies. If eligible, you will receive a detailed home assessment.



3. Accept a referral for home repairs if the assessment uncovers major asthma triggers. Repairs are available to renters or owners.
