WISCONSIN ASTHMA PLAN

The Wisconsin Asthma Plan serves as a blueprint for addressing asthma as a public health priority and lists the prioritized goals and activities to reduce the burden of asthma statewide. WAC members provide feedback and help update the plan every five years. The current plan has the following focus areas:

- Routine health care visits for assessment and monitoring
- Elimination or reduction of environmental triggers
- Pharmacological treatment
- Patient education

To improve health outcomes for children with asthma, our school-based partnerships focus on integrated care coordination among families, clinicians and school nurses. We connect partners, improve systems to support students with asthma and implement the Wisconsin Asthma Coalition school walkthrough program.

Thanks to SAMPRO™ more than 90% of patients with persistent asthma seen at Children's Wisconsin have Asthma Action Plans. This means that over 4,000 children have benefited from being part of a coordinated care effort between their physician, family and school to manage their asthma.



SCHOOL AND CHILD CARE WALKTHROUGH PROGRAM

Asthma is a leading cause of school absenteeism. Creating a healthy environment helps ensure children with asthma are able to learn. We work with staff to identify asthma triggers and offer low- and no-cost solutions to ensure an asthma-friendly environment for children and staff.

We use evidenced-based practices from our partners at the American Lung Association, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Department of Health Services, and Environmental Protection Agency to eliminate environmental asthma triggers.



As a result of our walkthrough program, 58% of schools and 73% of child care centers have made changes to improve the environment for children, staff and the community.
